Super League & Under League Format & Scheduling



- August 14, 2027 is the launch of the Super League ("SL") and the Under League ("UL").
- SL has 70 permanent schools (no relegation) plus 10 additional annually-rotating schools from UL. 80 schools each year.
- SL Permanent Members: 7 Divisions with 10 schools each = 70 schools
- The best 10 UL schools promoted each year to form the 8th division (regardless of geography) = 10 schools (see next slide).
- 14-game regular season games played across 15 weeks with the final weekend being Thanksgiving Weekend
- 9 division games + 5 non-divisional games determined by rotational and standings-based formulas. Emphasis on competitive equity.
- 8 division winners guaranteed the post-season = 8 schools. Each division winner gets a home game and hosts 1 st round wild card game.
- Plus 8 wild cards each year based on records/tie-breakers. 16 total post-season schools. (Room to grow to 24 without adding more weeks.)
- 4-game Post-Season (16 schools) played across 5 weeks. (20-week season in totality)
- 15th game: all schools play a mid-April Spring football "event" with game, concert, etc. (home every other year). College Football Spring Festival
- UL has 8 divisions with 7 schools per division = 56 schools (not counting the 10 playing "up" each year in SL).
- SL has 10 UL teams compete in SL annually as one division (regardless of geography)
- prior. No SL school is ever relegated. Model is promotion without relegation The 8 UL post-season teams from the previous year move up to the SL the following season, replacing the bottom 8 teams who competed up the year
- Model drives more interest in SL and UL and drives more media dollars in the UL packages.
- New schedule every year published February 1st.

Freshman (5%): all Freshman on the roster share pro rata equally in 5% of the school's "FB Player Pool."

Sophomores (15%): all Sophomores on the roster share pro rata equally in 15% of the school's "FB Player Pool."

Juniors (30%): all Juniors on the roster share pro rata equally in 30% of the school's "FB Player Pool."

Seniors/Grads (50%): all Seniors on the roster share pro rata equally in 50% of the school's "FB Player Pool."

Each of the 70 permanent SL School's FB Player Pool = $\frac{X\%}{6}$ of that season's median SL TV Pool. This will be collectively bargained

- reporting; i.e., can do deals with anybody, the school, collectives, third parties, etc. as long as properly reported/disclosed Type C: Individual NIL: Collectively bargain standard "rider" and reporting protocol for each individual student athlete's NIL deal(s). No constraints whatsoever other than
- Proposal: Student-Athletes free and totally unfettered to receive unlimited NIL moneys from A + B + C
- Proposal: Schools constrained by a "NIL Roster Cap" = A + B + C where C cannot exceed A + B.
- exceeds the NIL Roster Cap during a season, then in the next cycle it loses talent/player slots in the following order: NIL Roster Cap (the "NIL Roster Floor") for 2 consecutive years, it is relegated to the Under League until it maintains one full season at or above the NIL Roster Floor. If a school NIL Roster Cap is NIL only and would NOT limit cost of attendance, medical, academic and other non-cash educational benefits (unlimited). If a school is below 80% of the
- February Open Transfers: lose one (1) February slot until all 10 gone for each 0.25% over the Roster Cap, then March Supplemental Transfers: lose one (1) March slot until all 20 gone for each 0.25% over the Roster Cap, then
- HS Scholarship Offers: lose one (1) National Signing Day scholarship until all gone for each 0.25% over the Roster Cap.

Collectively Bargained Roster Management



- Super League & Under League schools have flexibility within the collectively bargained Roster Floor and Roster Cap.
- Student-athletes will also have flexibility, but should NOT be encouraged to transfer every single year
- **Five-for-Five** player eligibility model: players have 5-year-window of eligibility (must be enrolled as a full-time student).
- Within that 5-year-window, after their Sophomore season, student-athlete can transfer up to a max of two (2) times:
- Once in the February Open Transfer Portal and once in the March Supplemental Transfer Portal,
- ¥ OR
- Twice in the March Supplemental Transfer Portal.
- 85 Roster slots all counted within the Roster Cap: max 70 scholarship roster slots and max 15 non-scholarship.
- Non-scholarship walk-on student-athletes are eligible to receive NIL and count against the Roster Cap
- Minimum 50/70 scholarship roster slots each season must have come to the school directly from high school.
- Maximum 10/70 scholarship roster slots each season can come from the February Open Transfer Portal
- Maximum 10/70 scholarship roster slots each season can come from the March Supplemental Transfer Portal.

simultaneously creating an even greater incentive for schools to invest in, retain, develop and graduate players. System encourages student-athlete persistence (fewer transfer opportunities) to increase odds of graduation and

February Open Transfer Portal



- This would be collectively bargained.
- Open Transfers as currently practiced, limited to the month of February.

Student-athletes (SA's) are eligible to transfer once in the February Portal in their 5-year window.

- Player Transfer Payment ("PTP") owed by the school gaining the SA and paid to the school losing the SA.
- PTP = reimbursement of aggregate Type A League NIL paid to SA during time at school losing the SA.
- PTP amount counts 100% against the Roster Cap of the school gaining the student-athlete
- School gaining SA can choose to take full 100% hit in next cycle or amortize 50% hit across next two cycles.

March Supplemental Transfer Portal



- This would be collectively bargained.
- Within a 5-year-window, after their Sophomore season, student-athlete can transfer up to a max of two (2) times:
- Once in the February Open Transfer Portal and once in the March Supplemental Transfer Portal;
- V OR
- > Twice in the March Supplemental Transfer Portal.
- No Player Transfer Payment ("PTP") for a March transfer.
- SA lists between 5-10 schools/programs they are "applying" to (grounded in the high school & transfer portal statistics¹).
- Those 5-10 schools/programs receive the "application." Process is akin to how medical schools accept students
- Those 5-10 schools/programs accept or decline SA in reverse order of prior year on-field performance waiver wire style.
- The worst-performing school/program (of the 5-10 listed by the SA) has first choice and can accept or decline the SA.
- If that school/program takes a pass, then the next-worst on-field school/program can accept or decline the SA.
- SA would be obligated to attend the first school/program to accept their "application."
